Subject: Staff Recommended Redistricting Map

After reviewing the staff recommended redistricting map I would like to submit a few comments. These comments are ONLY on the staff recommended map and not on more general issues regarding redistricting options. In order to see where the issues exist it is necessary to zoom in on the interactive map to the point where you can actually see the location of individual structures.

Kent Woodlands neighborhood: The proposed division between District 2 and District 4 does not make sense. On the south side of Kent Woodlands portions of Crown Road and Good Hill Road are in District 4 and not District 2 and on the north side of the neighborhood portions of Ridgecrest, Crown Road, Evergreen and Blue Ridge are in District 4 and not District 2.

South side of West End neighborhood in San Rafael: Zooming in to look at the location of the residences, the proposed division between District 2 and District 1 really makes no sense.

Bret Harte neighborhood: Looking at the zoomed in view, the proposed division between District 2 and District 4 through this neighborhood really makes no sense.

Lincoln Ave. corridor: It should be pointed out that from Prospect to Mission the west (higher density) side of Lincoln Ave. is in District 1 and not District 4.

San Marin neighborhood: The proposed (and existing) division between District 5 and District 4 in this neighborhood really makes no sense - where portions of streets including San Miguel, San Luis and San Carlos are in a different district than the rest of the San Marin neighborhood. Using major landmarks such as Novato Creek or Novato Blvd. would be far more logical.

I am pointing out these areas for further consideration because this is a once in a decade opportunity to achieve logical district boundaries.
